All planned gatherings, meetings, and sporting events taking place at Gulfport facilities are cancelled through the end of March. Notices are being sent, advising those with events planned in April, about the likelihood of cancellations during that time frame, as well. As this situation progresses, we will likely scale down the number of employees occupying city offices, encouraging those who can work from home, to do so.	This pandemic represents a huge paradigm shift for our citizens. The regulations coming from the Federal and State levels should be taken seriously. If businesses think these recommendations are merely an option, we will all likely find ourselves in a lock-down mode. Fortunately, this disease does not have a high-mortality outcome (yet), but because of the rapid rate of spread, our hospitals and medical facilities can be quickly be overrun. The resulting domino effect can put citizens with high-mortality emergencies (i.e. heart attack, stroke) at great risk due to the unavailability of beds. This is why it is so important to take immediate action to limit social activities.
